



Christmas Present idea



In the September Newsletter there was a photograph of WW1 soldiers on Croxley Green. I received an email from Brian Thomson and have printed information about the photograph and his book which chronicles life in our area at that time

*'By the way, the photo of soldiers on the Green in your September edition is taken from a booklet of photos of the Croxley Green Red Cross VAD Hospital which was located in the Dickinson Institute on New Road. The soldiers in the photo had been wounded and were recuperating in Croxley. You will find lots more details in the book. Best wishes, **Brian Thomson**'*

Rickmansworth Historical Society has published Brian Thomson's history of Croxley Green in the First World War.

In 1914 Croxley Green was a small, closely knit community beside Dickinson's paper mill. Over the following four years Croxley people were thrust into the cauldron of international affairs. The Church Lads enlisted together to fight at the Somme. Volunteers rallied round to support a hospital for wounded soldiers. Well over 400 men from the village joined up. Every family was affected by the hardship, heartbreak and endurance of wartime. Brian's book is arranged as a chronicle of local events set within their national and international context. The narrative covers Dickinson's Croxley Mills, the Red Cross VAD Hospital and the activities of local schools and families. It begins with a brief survey of the village as it was in 1914, then follows the course of events until the peace agreement of 1919 and concludes by describing how the community commemorated the war. 57 local men are remembered on the war memorial on the Green. Their deaths are marked at the relevant points in the narrative. Special attention is given to the Croxley Church Lads who were

New Neighbourhood Watch scheme launched in Three Rivers

A new scheme aimed to protect older people living in Three Rivers has been launched.

'Senior Watch' was created in the wake of a large number of scam phone calls made to residents. Officers based in the Oxhey Safer Neighbourhood Team needed to find a way to disseminate essential safety information to their older residents in order to arm them with essential advice to prevent them from falling victim to crime. The scheme will run similarly to Neighbourhood Watch, where messages and information

are shared to members through the 'Online Watch Link' portal (OWL). 'OWL' updates are e-mailed updates and are alerts of any crimes/warnings relevant to this area.

TOWPATH IMPROVEMENTS



You will have noticed during the summer that work has been carried out along the towpath near our lock 79. The towpath has been given a base and fine shingle has been laid on top. This has improved the path, over grown bushes have been cut back making it better when walking, cycling or jogging. Work was also carried out to strengthen the bank in places. They have also been working on an area where boats are continually moored which is the opposite side to the towpath near the lock and bridge. Creating a new bridge and steps across this area. A little surprised by this as the Canal and River Trust (previously British Waterways) was always trying to get these long stay vessels to move on! The work has been carried out over a 5 mile stretch and Three Rivers District Council, Hertfordshire County Council and Watford Borough Council have all contributed to funding the work. Have a walk along it and see what you think of the improvements.

REDUCE YOUR SPEED – NOW!!

Don't be the cause of an accident – reduce your speed to 20mph or less !!



Can you please keep your speeds down around Byewaters, there are lots of blind spots, mainly caused by parked cars. Please do not be the cause of an accident, slow, slow and slower should be our mantra and keep everyone safe. Don't be the cause of an accident. Trying to get a buggy or wheelchair around cars parked on the pavement or having to go into the road is unacceptable. When eventually Byewaters is adopted by the local council they will issue fines for this. A charge will be sent to the owner of a vehicle that causes damage to the pavement. Please try NOT to park on the pavements especially all four wheels. Besides this barring the way for buggies, wheelchairs and the blind – it causes slip hazards from oil or damage to the pavement, always think of others.

A HIDDEN GEM

The Three Rivers Museum is located in Rickmansworth at 46 High Street WD3 1HP between the Library and Watersmeet, in Basing House (itself of great historical significance as the former home of William Penn, founder of Pennsylvania). The Museum houses an interesting and varied collection of historical artefacts and old photographs of the Three Rivers area. A range of permanent and temporary displays provides a visual history of the area – its development, buildings, personalities, transport, local businesses and industries – while our collection of memorabilia provides a wider perspective on bygone times. Opening times Monday to Friday from 2pm to 4pm and Saturday from 10am to 4pm. The museum is run entirely by volunteers. Admission to the museum is FREE. (A small donation towards our running costs is always welcome.) Please come and pay us a visit, you are all welcome.



AND NOW FOR SOMETHING COMPLETELY DIFFERENT... ANOTHER BIN !! BUT NOT A WHEELIE BIN, MORE OF A BUCKET !!!

Since receiving that wheelie bin another (silver bucket) has arrived for food scraps!! We are still allowed to put our scraps in old newspapers or corn starch bags but this is only for food waste. Let us hope that the little critters don't figure out how to open these, could be messy! My advice is to keep it firmly closed so as not to invite unwanted guests sniffing around it. Should be fun over Christmas with carcasses etc. and a few weeks of scraps building up! The Green top wheelie bin takes newspapers, magazines, plain cards, telephone directories etc. aerosols, clean foil, plastic containers & bottles etc. cartons, cardboard, glass bottles and jars. 


