BYEWATERS IN 1926

Can you find where your house is? This is John Dickinson's (Croxley) Paper Mill around 1926. Croxley Common Moor can be seen above the mill. Barges are pictured transporting goods to and from the mill, some going to Apsley mills and others going to London. There are houses at the bottom which were for the Manager and Foreman of the mill, these were later demolished as the mill expanded. To the right are the gardens and orchards of Nuttfield House. The house was built for a mill Manager, it was the first property in Croxley Green to have electricity which came directly from the mill. The house was sold off to make way for the Frankland Road houses and this was originally called the Nuttfield Estate taking the name from the local fields.


And we are back into the New Year and we left Watford just as they were going to play the Red Devils of Man Utd. Fans were getting concerned that Deeney's scoring rate had dropped. No fears as he scored twice in this fixture. It was just that he scored for both sides and the 'Orns lost 2-0. Well, he scored so why complain? Up to The Villa next who are struggling at bottom of the division. Watford won 3-2 with Ighalo getting two and Watson one. A visit from the Canaries next and the Hornets certainly ruffled their feathers with a 2-0 win with the usual Deeney/Ighalo scoring. The long trip up to tame the Black Cats in front of 44,000 fans with Ighalo getting his 10th goal to keep them in their cage and winning. Now the start of a very heavy Christmas fixture list with a home game against Liverpool. Watford were on song and slotted 3 passed their 'keeper. Ake and 2 from Ighalo again gave the Golden Boys their 4th consecutive win in the Premiership placing them 7th

DISPOSING OF YOUR WASTE – BE AWARE!

People are paying unlicensed waste carriers to dispose of their waste. If waste originating from your property is found to have been fly-tipped, you are obliged to provide 3Rivers with details of who you gave it to. This means the matter will be taken up with that person directly. If you are hiring someone to remove waste they need to have a Waste Carrier's Licence. The waste carrier should also provide you with a Waste Transfer Note when removing the waste. Ask for their Waste Carrier number and call the Environmental Agency on 03708 506 506 and ask for a validation check, or you can go on line www.gov.uk Did you know 3Rivers provides a special kerbside collection service for large items. Of course at the local waste disposal sites and recycling centres you can safely and legally recycle/dispose of unwanted items. For more information visit www.threerivers.gov.uk or call 01923 776611 **Using unauthorised waste removers means you may be prosecuted and run the risk of a £5,000 fine and a criminal record.**

Neighbourhood Watch

Unexpected telephone call? Police are urging people to be aware of phone scams, which are operating in the area. How it works: The offender rings someone, often the elderly, claiming to be a police officer or bank worker investigating fraudulent transactions. They then persuade their victim to part with their personal information, including PIN numbers. Next they ask them to send them their bank cards and/or withdraw money and send it to them via a courier, claiming it's needed as evidence. If you receive a call you're not expecting, you should be suspicious. Please remember the police and banks would: **NEVER** ask for your bank account details or PIN number over the phone. **NEVER** ask you to withdraw money and send it to them via any means. **NEVER** ask you to send your bank cards, or any other personal property, via any means. They could even suggest they send a courier to you to collect your bank card.

If you are not happy with a phone call and are suspicious of the conversation you have with the caller then please end the call and contact police via the non-emergency number, 101. **Remember, when reporting a suspicious phone call to police, wait at least five minutes before attempting to make the call, preferably use a mobile, or test the line first by phoning a friend or relative, to ensure you're not reconnected to the offender.** Please remember to share this advice with your relatives, friends and neighbours. General Contact Advice: Telephone 999 in an emergency where there is a danger to life or a crime is in progress. Telephone 101 for non-emergencies where police attendance is required, to report a crime or to report any other incidents. Calls to 101 have a fixed cost of 15p per call.

FOULING – NOT ON BYEWATERS !

It would be frowned upon should I remove her nappy and let her defecate in the street so why do some dog owners still feel they do not need to remove their pets mess - shame on you!!!** Biodegradable bags are FREE from the Parish Council Offices and some libraries. Always think of others and use bags to pick up after your pet and then BIN it!!



Don't be the cause of an accident – 20mph or less !!

Do not be the cause of an accident drive slowly around the estate and park sensibly so that visibility is not obscured for either pedestrians or other vehicles. Please, please can you keep your speeds down **20mph or less** is best. Please think of others and try not to park on pavements or on blind spots. (Parking large vehicles on or close to corners is not advisable.) If your vehicle damages a pavement you

will have to be charged for the repair. Please always think of others when driving and parking around Byewaters.






