METROPOLITAN LINE EXTENSION – FORMERLY THE CROXLEY RAIL LINK

London Underground took over the delivery of this project in November 2015. Work to re-route and extend the Metropolitan line to Watford Junction will start in 2016. The aim is for the project (formerly the Croxley Rail Link) to be completed in 2020. The extension will divert Metropolitan line trains to serve the existing Watford Junction and Watford High Street stations. Two new stations will be created at Cassiobridge and Watford Vicarage Road. The existing Watford station will close after the new stations open. In preparation for building the new viaduct over Baldwins Lane and Watford Road a number of utilities have to be diverted. The work will be in phases from Saturday, 27th February 2016 for 6 months. This will divert water, gas, electric and communication services from the vicinity so that the building work can commence. Also tree clearance work will take place from mid-January to the end of March 2016 to avoid the bird nesting season. The extension of the Metropolitan line will:



- Improve access to public transport for local residents
 - Create new links to Watford General Hospital, Croxley Business Park and Cardiff Road Industrial Estate, increasing employment opportunities
 - Provide access for Metropolitan line passengers to West Coast mainline National Rail links from Watford Junction station.

STEP FREE ACCESS TO CROXLEY STATION

A petition was handed over to TFL on Wednesday, 16th March during a liaison meeting in Croxley. The petition was signed by 3328 people and really shows the depth of feeling on the issue. Barry Grant, Cllr. Peter Getkahn and Cllr Chris Lloyd also took part in a conference call on Friday with TFL representatives, where funding and future options were discussed for over an hour. **You can still add your signature on the Change.org website <https://www.change.org/p/step-free-access-for-croxley>** The Croxley Rail Link is an investment of approximately £284 million in improving public transport in the area. The actual benefits to the Croxley community are small and are based around improved connections to Watford (there will be little improvement to the London bound service).

Despite both new stations having Step-free access installed, Croxley station will remain without. This situation discriminates against Croxley residents who have difficulty with access (e.g. elderly, disabled or mothers with children in pushchairs) that are precisely the group that would benefit most from a direct connection to the local hospital. **Please add your signature and or complain to the Croxley Green Residents Association and the Croxley Green Liberal Democrats who are leading this fight.**



Croxley Revels, Saturday 18th June from 1.30 to 5.00pm

The Croxley Revels is a traditional summer village fayre held annually on the afternoon of the Saturday closest to summer solstice. The first "modern day Revels" was held in 1920. The Croxley Green Society was inaugurated in 1938 and was formed for the celebration of King George VI's Jubilee. The Revels site incorporates virtually the entirety of The Green and is set up during the early morning by a large group of enthusiastic local residents. The organisation of this event is led by a group of local residents informally known as the Revels Committee. There is a small proportion of commercial stalls otherwise the organisation and set up is entirely voluntary and dependent on the goodwill of local residents and businesses. The Revels team ensures that, by 8pm, there is no evidence that anything so grand has taken place save for a couple of skips that bulge with refuse! There are between 65 and 90 stalls (annual

variations), an arena that stages all manner of entertainment and activities from judo exhibitions to Morris dancers; the school's Pushball tournament to Maypole dancing. The Revels Princess is paraded in the grand procession around the village. Periphery interests include children's funfair; storytelling, roving jazz band; classic vehicles and bicycles. All the fun of the fair! As people roam the Revels site they are exposed to stalls and entertainments run by most of the local clubs, societies and local charities. The organising committee strives to strike a balance in providing a good mixture of traditional and modern entertainment, reflecting the heritage of the village as well as what is currently happening in and around the community. The aim is to appeal to all age groups and to promote family participation in the Revels and, as a consequence, in the community as a whole.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH - New partnership to provide environmental crime messages to the Three Rivers area.

Three Rivers Council Environmental Services are teaming up with Neighbourhood Watch and Three Rivers Safer Neighbourhood Policing Team to send out messages to involve the local community and raise awareness about environmental issues. Building on the success of Online Watch Link (OWL) messages to over 20,000 Neighbourhood Watch Members across the district, alerts will now include environmental crimes and anti-social behaviour, covering topics including fly tipping, abandoned vehicles, graffiti and littering. These issues are of concern to local communities. This service builds on a flourishing partnership between local police, Neighbourhood Watch and Three Rivers District Council. The aim is to reduce crime and improve the environment of Three Rivers. FOULING – NOT ON BYEWATERS !

Things have improved a little over the years but there are still a few owners who feel they don't need to pick up when their pet fouls. We have run various articles in this section alerting people to the dangers of leaving dog faeces for children (and others) to fall in and cause permanent damage to eyes etc. I am even more aware of this now that little Mia is walking and we have to watch where she treads. This photo is of little Aimee Langdon she appeared in the national press in 2010 and we told you about her in the September 2012 newsletter. As you can see her left eye has been infected with Toxocariasis after coming into contact with dog faeces. She slipped in dog mess in a children's playground and before her mother could stop her she had wiped her eye and now is blind in her left eye. It only took a couple of seconds but she will now have to live with this disability all her life. Please, please pick up don't let your pet be the cause of a child losing their eye sight. Biodegradable bags are FREE from the Parish Council Offices and some libraries. Always think of others and use bags to pick up after your pet and then BIN it!!

WATFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL – OUR CLOSE NEIGHBOUR – REFUSE AND RECYCLING

I was speaking to a friend who lives in our neighbouring borough and was surprised to find out that their bins and collections are different to ours. They have a Blue lidded Bin collected weekly – this is much the same as our green lidded bin for recycling (weekly). Then there is a Black bin collected weekly much the same as our green bin (both for household waste) but ours is not being collected weekly!! Also a green lidded bin for garden waste, tea bags, vegetable peelings and cooked and uncooked food leftovers which is collected fortnightly. This is much the same as we used to have for our brown bin. Important to note – from July 3Rivers residents are going to be charged extra for brown bins the figure quoted for this year is £35, this is on top of our council tax. Why is Watford borough allowed to have weekly collections on their recycling and household waste bins and not have an extra charge on their garden waste bins? On the surface it seems 3Rivers residents are getting a raw deal! There was a local public consultation and over three quarters of those who replied (around 4,000) said they were prepared to pay up to £35 per year for a fortnightly garden waste service! Were you surveyed??



CORN STARCH BAGS are available for your silver food scraps bucket, they are an alternative to using old newspapers. They can be bought from Parish Council Offices and other places including the hardware store at the beginning of Baldwins Lane (near the Harvester). 




