RICKMANSWORTH FESTIVAL – 19th & 20th MAY

The Rickmansworth Festival takes place on the third weekend of May every year and celebrates canals, the community and the environment. The 25th Festival, the highlight of the town's annual calendar and the finale of Rickmansworth Week, will be held on the 19th and 20th May 2018. The top attraction for many is the wonderful array of canal boats from across the country - a terrific spectacle, with at least 100 craft of many types and histories, moored along the towpath up to four deep. But there are things to do, see and enjoy whatever your interests, and whatever your age. The Rickmansworth Festival started as a purely canal based event in 1993, as part of the British Waterways "Canals 200" celebration that year. The first (1993) was on a large scale, incorporating the Aquadrome as the main location for land based activities. Subsequent Festivals were much smaller, but they steadily grew in size and scope. At least 20,000 people now come each year. The Festival now occupies part of the Aquadrome, the towpath between Stockers Lock and Batchworth, and the area round Batchworth Lock. You'll find a range of music and performing arts, displays and presentations, traders, boats and catering. Come and join us.

The Blues at the Vic next on a cold Monday night with the Sky cameras watching. Not a good omen. Ah, Chelsea have a player red carded so 11 v 10. Chelsea to park the bus? But wait, the 'Orns have a penalty and take the lead 1 up! Second half and Chelsea equalise 1 all, typical, is Watford going to lose 2-1? No, 8 minutes to go and Watford change up a gear or is it Brazil on the pitch? Boot, in goes Watford's second, bang, in goes the third, boom, in goes the fourth all in 7 minutes!! 4-1 and Watford win!! Next off to East London and away to West Ham - "East, West but Watford's best". Ah, whoops, 1-0 down just before half time. Another goal for the Hammers in the second half gives the win to West Ham at 2-0. Oh well, the week did start well. Right, heads up and we go again as we enter the last quarter of the season. It will be nice to stay up in a solid position this season, so my advice? Don't look downwards just yet

CROXLEY COMMON MOOR






FREE BRITISH RED CROSS APP



The British Red Cross have recently released a **Free Emergency App** for apple and android devices that provides real-time alerts, severe weather warnings and practical advice to the public in preparing for and responding to emergencies. The app can also be set up to provide alerts that may affect family or friends elsewhere in the country. The Constabulary has engaged with the Red Cross on this and would recommend it as an excellent way in helping individuals and communities to prepare for and be informed about local emergencies such as severe weather conditions etc. Neighbourhood Watch would encourage you to consider downloading and using this app to help ensure you are better informed and prepared. The British Red Cross are very keen to work with the police/neighbourhood watch to help improve the resilience of our communities to deal with emergency/urgent events and to improve what the app offers, so would welcome any feedback users of the app may have. SLOW DOWN ... CHILDREN PLAYING



Don't be the cause of an accident. 20mph or less !!

Please drive slowly around the estate and park sensibly so that visibility is not obscured for either pedestrians or other vehicles. Please keep your speeds down – **20mph or less** is best.

FIX MY STREET ARE HERE TO HELP

They cover the whole of the UK. <https://www.fixmystreet.com> is an independent website, built by the charity **mySociety**. You can report problems in your community, even if you don't know who those reports should go to. FixMyStreet sends your reports direct to your local council. They are then published online so others in the community can read, discuss and offer advice where/when needed. All you have to do is type in a postcode and describe your problem for example **Dog Fouling**. They then send your report to the people whose job it is to fix it. There is an app for iOS and an Android app, Nokia Ovi app. If your phone isn't supported try accessing FixMyStreet via your mobile browser. FixMyStreet is primarily for reporting things which are broken or dirty or damaged or dumped, and need fixing, cleaning or clearing, like graffiti, **dog fouling**, potholes or street lights that don't work. Hopefully this can help in the fight to stop children getting Toxocariasis from dog faeces. **Biodegradable bags are FREE** from the Parish Council Offices and some libraries. Always think of others and use bags to pick up after your pet and then **BIN IT** – preferably in a **RED** waste bin.
