MILL LANE – MESS

Byewaters residents have a short cut to Croxley Met station and local shops by walking or cycling up Mill Lane. Unfortunately Mill Lane becomes very dirty and slippery every winter when mud and dead leaves accumulate on the surface (pictured). Vehicles parking on the verges, and thus churning them up, increase this mud. Also parked vehicles sometimes make it hard for pedestrians or cyclists to pass. All such parking is unauthorised, as Mill Lane is classed as a "bridleway". Hertfordshire County Council accepts responsibility for Mill Lane's lighting and drains, but not for clearing the surface. In practice it does not clear the drainage gullies often enough. Neither does Croxley Green Parish Council accept responsibility for clearing the surface, though it has done so occasionally as a goodwill gesture. 

We left the Hornets after a cold evening at Norwich but next game was at home against Burnley. Unfortunately we lost at home 3-0. Next down to Southampton where we took an early lead via Sarr but lost again 2-1. Up to Leicester next where as the norm, VAR went against us with another weird decision - 4th time - with a very dodgy penalty which was duly scored and Watford lost again 2-0. Well here we are again with another new manager, after having relieved QSF of his duties and an interim manager Hayden Mullins, in for a couple of games, a saviour a-Pearson-the horizon! Yep, start 2020 as I mean to go on.... Mullins was in charge of the home match against Palace with Nigel Pearson looking on which ended as a 0-0 draw. Up to Liverpool where the 'Orns had one of the best displays so far against the league leaders but lost 2-0. Man Utd next at the Vic where Sarr and Deeney scored to beat the Red Devil's 2-0. THE SOUND OF SILENCE continued...



Sue wrote in the newsletters September edition of the reduction in both bird song and bird sightings on Byewaters. Bird song is at a peak during the breeding season, and then much diminished later in the year. Robins are unusual in continuing to sing throughout the year. So a reduction in bird song during the year is not by itself cause for concern. However the reduction in bird sightings over the years is certainly cause for concern. Nationally, far more bird species are declining than increasing. That is equally true of other forms of wildlife. There are various causes: including loss of suitable habitat, and modern farming methods. As farmland becomes increasingly unfavourable to wildlife, our gardens become increasingly important alternatives for wildlife. Covering gardens with hard surfacing (decking, patios, parking areas) is unfavourable to wildlife. For example the greater the soft surfaces, the more insects and worms for birds to eat. And a pond is a plus for wildlife in any garden.

CHESLYN HOUSE - a local hidden gem

Often described as Watford's best kept secret, Cheslyn House and Gardens is another of Watford's Green Flag Award winners. Its 3.5 acres of space is imaginatively laid out to invite exploration, providing a myriad of interesting areas



including a pond, fernery, large herbaceous borders and an aviary. Designed by renowned architect Henry Colbeck and his wife, Daisy, who originally owned the house and gardens. The gardens have a collection of unusual and exotic plants which they collected whilst travelling the world. Among the special delights you can still see today are the whimsical sweetgum tree, the handsome Indian bean tree and the distinctive tulip tree. Beyond the house, you can explore the dense woodland garden, which is full of colour in spring when the azaleas and rhododendrons are in full bloom. The new features, such as the pond, bird aviary, rock garden and large herbaceous borders, have encouraged new wildlife to visit the gardens, including dragonflies, damselflies, frogs, newts, fish and water insects. The council has maintained the semi-natural woodland area since 1965, increasing the size of the gardens to their present day size of 1.41 hectares (3.5 acres). The brick arch leading to the woodland area is all that remains of the original boundary of the gardens. The Colbecks travelled far and wide, which is reflected in the range of unusual and exotic plants in the gardens. **Further details:** - Open all year round, except for Christmas Day, Boxing Day and New Year's Day. There are also toilets on site. November to February - 9am to 4pm. March to October - 9am to 6pm. April to September - 9am to 8pm. There is wheelchair access to the formal open area at the front and limited wheelchair access to the semi natural woodland area at the back. Dogs are permitted in the gardens on leads. (Please clean up after your dog.) You can travel to Cheslyn House and Gardens by bus (R8 and 318) or train (Watford Junction is a 25 minute walk away). There is a small car park and limited roadside parking. Cheslyn House, Nascot Wood Road, Watford WD17 4SL more information can be found online.

Parking Meter Scam

We have been alerted to scams involving parking meters. The scam happens when you are approached by someone who pleads with you to help them with a parking meter that won't accept their foreign card. They ask you to use your card to make their car park payment, and they will give you the cash. Once you have entered your card and PIN number, your card will not come out of the machine. They have used a device to capture it. They ring who they say is the meter company who tells you they will send an engineer to fix the machine and will contact you later to return your card. Once you have left, they retrieve your card and use it. Please alert neighbours and relatives to this scam.



Protect Your Money: - If you enter your card into any form of payment machine and are unable to retrieve it for any reason, you should immediately contact your bank to stop the card. Whenever you enter your PIN number, ensure that nobody can see the number - use your other hand to block the view of any onlookers. If you are approached by someone in the manner described above, please decline their request and report the suspicious behaviour to police.

FOULING & LITTER ON BYEWATERS

It has been brought to my attention that Byewaters has been included in the PSPO for Three Rivers Council. PSPO is a Public Spaces Protection Order and the full order can be viewed on <http://www.threerivers.gov.uk/service/public-space-protection-order-pspo>

Basically this means that owners not removing their dog's faeces on Byewaters can be fined £75 (maximum fine of £1000). You can report anyone seen not removing dog faeces to Three Rivers Council or contact FixMyStreet <http://www.fixmystreet.com> and they will send a report to Three Rivers. **FixMyStreet** does cover other matters as well such as dumped items, clearing graffiti, potholes etc. and of course dog fouling. They send your report to the people whose job it is to fix it.



There is an app for iOS and an Android app, Nokia Ovi app. If your phone isn't supported try accessing FixMyStreet via your mobile browser.

Hopefully this can help in the fight to keep our street clean and there is no excuse as biodegradable bags are FREE from the Parish Council Offices and some libraries.

Always think of others and use bags to pick up after your pet and then BIN it preferably in a RED waste bin.

DON'T BE THE CAUSE OF AN ACCIDENT



20mph or less!!

Please drive slowly around the estate and park sensibly so that visibility is not obscured for either pedestrians or other vehicles. Please keep your speeds down – **20mph or less** is best. Please try not to park on pavements or on blind spots. (Parking large vehicles on or close to corners is not advisable.) If your vehicle damages a pavement you will have to be charged for the repair. Muntjac deer (no bigger than a large dog) have been seen crossing Byewaters estate roads: another good reason to drive slowly on our estate. Please always think of others when driving and parking around Byewaters.
